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Initiatives and Accomplishments

The Council remains a trusted advisor to the Principal and the Ottawa-Carleton District School Board (OCDSB) on education-related issues and decisions. In addition to its advisory responsibility the Council continues to drive several key initiatives to enhance student learning and enrich the experience for every student. This past year, the Council:

Student Well-Being

- Partnered with Fallingbrook's Safe and Inclusive Committee to help devise and implement a comprehensive action plan to educate and promote mindfulness.
- Developed and implemented a communication strategy to enhance communications between parents, teachers, and the broader school community. We have been very active keeping in touch regularly over the school year on our <u>Facebook</u> page and through our new <u>Twitter</u> handle. Follow us!
- Hosted and welcomed 50+ guests to a community event on selfregulation in children and adolescence presented by the OCDSB's Mental Health Initiative Team, providing parents and guardians with strategies to help support their child's skills at home.
- Secured funding to improve community safety for our students walking to school with a new crossing guard serving the very busy Montcrest and Princess Louise intersection.
- Coordinated several school lunch programs and socials, including Pita Pit, Lunch Lady, the student favourite hot dog days, Halloween dance, Movie Nights, and Run 4 Fun.

Facilities

- Received support from School Trustee, Keith Penny, and delivered a business case to the Board for A/C or an alternate mean to cool down the school.
- Updated the garden bed around the school sign and refreshed the bicycle racks with some new coats of paint.
- Advocated for inviting, comfortable, safe and accessible school, and secured funding to paint the exterior of the school, including a mural facing the primary yard.
- Collaborated with City Councilor, Matthew Luloff and in early stage planning for improving joint use amenities, including the addition of park picnic tables by the junior yard to serve the student body and community use.
